FRANKLIN-LAVOISIER PRIZE 2018

Jointly created by the **SCIENCE HISTORY INSTITUTE** (formerly Chemical Heritage Foundation), Philadelphie, USA, and the **FONDATION DE LA MAISON DE LA CHIMIE**, Paris, France, the **FRANKLIN-LAVOISIER PRIZE** is intended to reward a person, a group of persons or an organization for their meritorious contribution, through their action or publications, to:

- the preservation and highlighting of the scientific and industrial heritage, in France, the USA, or worldwide in the field of chemistry and its applications
- a better knowledge of chemical and molecular sciences and industries
- the fostering of closer Franco-American ties and the promotion of prominent achievements in the fields of chemical sciences and industries

Carrying an initial monetary award of 15 000 €uros, the FRANKLIN-LAVOISIER PRIZE will be awarded every second year by an **internal Jury** consisting of :

2 permanent members:

- Bernard BIGOT, President, Fondation de la Maison de la Chimie
- Robert Anderson, President, Science History Institute

3 co-opted members:

- Carsten REINHARDT, Professor, University of Bielefeld
- Robert FOX, Emeritus Professor of the History of Science, Oxford University
- Brigitte VAN TIGGELEN, Director, Office of the President Europe, Science History Institute

Nominations must be submitted no later than 30 March 2018.

The 2018 Franklin-Lavoisier Prize will be presented to the laureate on Wednesday 18 October 2018 during a formal ceremony organized at the Science History Institute in Philadelphia.
