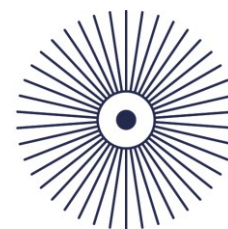

2022 FRANKLIN-LAVOISIER PRIZE

Jointly created by the **FONDATION DE LA MAISON DE LA CHIMIE**, Paris (France) and the **SCIENCE HISTORY INSTITUTE**, Philadelphia (USA), the **FRANKLIN-LAVOISIER PRIZE** is intended to reward a person, a group of persons or an organization for their meritorious contribution, through their action or publications, to:

- the preservation and highlighting of the scientific and industrial heritage, in France, the USA, or worldwide in the field of chemistry and its applications
- a better knowledge of chemical and molecular sciences and industries
- the fostering of closer Franco-American ties and the promotion of prominent achievements in the fields of chemical sciences and industries

Carrying an initial monetary award of €15,000, the FRANKLIN-LAVOISIER PRIZE will be awarded every second year by an **international Jury** consisting of:

2 permanent members :

3 co-opted members :

Nominations must be submitted no later than 31st March 2022.

The 2022 Franklin-Lavoisier Prize will be presented to the laureate in the Autumn 2022 at Philadelphia (USA) at the headquarters of the Science History Institute.
